### Tips for your Next Family Event

# Asking the Questions

Take advantage of the festive time of year to ask questions about holiday traditions.

- What was the most memorable holiday gift you have ever received?
- What was a holiday-related activity your family always did together?
- When you were growing up, what food did your family have for a holiday meal?

Don't limit yourself to holiday-related topics.

- Tell me the story of how you met your spouse or partner?
- What did you like to do for fun as a kid?
- What was your first job? How old were you when you got it?
- What was one thing your family did every week? Every summer? Every year?
- What was your most treasured belonging growing up?
- Where did your name come from?

#### Regardless of the topic:

- Ask detailed and specific questions.
- Try to think of questions that evoke one of the five senses.
- Always ask follow-up questions that come to mind.

# Capturing the Stories

Use your phone to record the conversation.

Purchase an affordable digital audio recorders. Expect to pay between \$35-\$125.

Consider a lapel mic for better audio with either option. Expect to pay between \$10-\$100.

Regardless of what device you use to record, always have a back-up option!

### Preserving & Sharing the Stories

Easily share the audio with family.

- Hand out thumb drives with the audio at your next family get-together.
- Create a folder in the cloud that only family members can access.
- Set-up a private website or Facebook page that only family members can access.

Transcribe the audio to share in written form.

- Utilize the transcribe function in word processing software to create a first draft.

Preserve the audio for future generations.

- Donate a copy to your local archive, library, or historical or genealogical society.
